#### GUIDELINES FOR PUBLIC CONDUCT DURING TOWN BOARD MEETINGS

- 1. The Supervisor shall preside at the meetings of the Town Board. In the absence of the Supervisor, the Deputy Supervisor shall be the acting Supervisor. In the event both the Supervisor and the Deputy Supervisor are absent, the other members shall designate one of their members to act as temporary chairman. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but a lesser number may adjourn.
- 2. Town residents who wish to speak shall fill out a card at the entrances of the meeting room listing their name, contact information, and the subject matter in which they would like to speak. These cards will be collected prior to the beginning of the Town Board meeting and given to the Town Supervisor or Deputy Supervisor in the absence of the Supervisor.
- 3. Speakers must be recognized by the presiding officer and then proceed to the lectern and state their name and address. They must limit their remarks on official town business to up to three minutes on a given topic and may not yield any remaining time to another speaker. They must address their remarks to the Board as a body and not to any member thereof and not to other members of the audience in the form of a debate.
- 4. Speakers should present their remarks in a courteous manner and may not make disparaging remarks or personal comments about public officials, town residents, or others. All speakers will observe the commonly accepted rules of courtesy, decorum, dignity, and good taste with no cursing, swearing, clapping, booing, finger pointing, bullying, whispering, or talking that disrupts the proceedings of the business of the Town Board.
- 5. Any speaker who disregards the directives of the presiding officer in enforcing the rules, disturbs the peace at a meeting, makes impertinent or slanderous remarks, or generally conducts themselves in an inappropriate manner shall be barred from further participation and will forfeit any balance of time remaining for their comments.
- 6. After a final warning, if a speaker willfully refuses to step down, the Town Supervisor shall contact the appropriate authorities to remove the speaker from the meeting room and to restore order.
- 7. The Town Supervisor, or in their absence the Deputy Supervisor, shall ensure compliance with these rules.

## RESOLUTION APPROVING 284 AGREEMENT FOR EXPENDITURE OF HIGHWAY MONEYS

**RESOLVED** that the Agreement for Expenditure of Highway Monies submitted by Highway Superintendent Alan VanWormer (Highway 284 Agreement) is hereby approved.

## AGREEMENT FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF HIGHWAY MONEYS

AGREEMENT between the Town Superintendent of Highways of the Town of New Baltimore
Greene County, New York, and the undersigned members of the Town Board.
Pursuant to the provisions of Section 284 of the Highway Law, we agree that moneys levied and
collected in the Town for the repair and improvement of highways, and received from the State for State
Aid for the repair and improvement of highways, shall be expended as follows:

- 1. **GENERAL REPAIRS**. The sum of \$70,000 shall be set aside to be expended for primary work and general repairs upon 63 miles of town highways, including sluices, culverts and bridges having a span of less than five feet and boardwalks or the renewals thereof.
- 2. **PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS**. The following sums shall be set aside to be expended for the permanent improvement of Town highways:
- a. On the road commencing at Staco Road and leading to Greenville Town line, a distance of 0.6 miles, there shall be expended not over the sum of \$108,527.20. Type: Cold Mix Pave Width of traveled surface: 20 feet Subbase: N/A Thickness: 3 inches Cold mix pave Featherbed Lane from Staco Road to Greenville Town line and single course chip seal. b. On the road commencing at West Deans Mill Road and leading to Coeyman Town line, a distance of 1.3 miles, there shall be expended not over the sum of \$194,880.00. Type: Hot mix pave Width of traveled surface: 20 feet Subbase: N/A Thickness: 1.5 inches Hot mix pave Saw Mill Road from West Deans Mill Road to Coeymans Town line. True and level as needed and pave with 1.5 inches of 12.5 mm top.

#### Town of New Baltimore Planning Board Monthly Report March 25, 2024

The Planning Board met on March 14, 2024, with the following business conducted:

Public Hearing was held at 7 p.m. on the Mark James Minor Subdivision Application followed by the Public Hearing on the LSE Monoceros, LLC Site Plan Application (New Baltimore Solar Project) for a 4.8 MW-ac utility-scale solar collector system.

In the Regular Monthly Meeting that followed:

...The James Minor Subdivision was approved.

...Discussion continued on the New Baltimore Solar Project. Parts 2 and 3 of the Full Environmental Assessment Form were gone through. It was determined that the project will not result in any significant adverse impacts on the environment, an environmental impact statement need not be prepared; and as a result, a negative declaration was issued. To allow for amendment and additional conditions to be added to the draft resolution, Board action on the resolution was postponed until the April Board Meeting.

...Daniel Hershberg from Hershberg & Hershberg was present to give a brief update on the warehouse/light industrial buildings project proposed by US Route 9W, LLC for the property located on Route 9W just south of Kreitmeier Road and to request that the Board move forward with the appointment of a Town designated engineer to review the plans. The Planning Board will be sending out the required RFP's to begin this process.

...Jason Singer from Nolan Engineering was present on behalf of Cheema Petro, LLC to give a brief update on the gas station/convenient store proposed for property located just north of New Baltimore Family Dentistry on Route 9W and to request that the Board move forward with the appointment of a Town designated engineer to review the plans. The Planning Board will send out the required RFP's as soon as updated application material is submitted reflecting that this project will be located on four acres rather than the two initially proposed.
