

"Ticked Off" Lyme Forum to Share Info on Tick-Borne Diseases

Spring is here and the ticks are out -- and hungry! Caution, education, and awareness are important for everyone in the area: men, women, children, and pets. If you live near or visit wooded or grassy areas, have pets that come in and out of the house, or work in high risk environments, the risk for Lyme and other tick borne infections exists.

Being informed and pro-active are your best strategies to protect you from serious illness. To help provide information on the subject of Lyme disease and the numerous co-infections that often accompany Lyme, Kelstar Industries of Durham, NY, with assistance from the Lyme Action Network, will present a public information forum entitled "GREEN COUNTY'S TICKED OFF! Lyme and Tick Borne Illness Forum" on Monday, May 5th from 2:45 - approx.5:30pm at the Greenville High School Auditorium, 4976 New York 81, NY 12083.

Guest speakers will include:

- 1. Richard Horowitz, MD internationally recognized expert on tick-borne diseases and author of NY Times Best seller "Why Can't I Get Better", will explain the newest understandings about the nature of long-term infections and how the body reacts to tick-borne pathogens. Dr. Horowitz will be available for booksigning after the presentation.
- 2. Professor Holly Ahern Microbiology professor, SUNY Adirondack, will discuss the basics of Lyme disease: the biology, the misinformation, and what you need to know to protect yourself and your family -- even after a tick bite.
- 3. **Ronald Stram, MD**, will discuss the range of traditional and alternative therapies to address the broad range of problems resulting from Borrelia, babesia, bartonella, anaplasma, ehrlichia, and other pathogens common to our region.
- 4. Christina Fisk, President, Lyme Action Network Lyme disease is more than just a biological problem. The malfunctioning of government agencies has further compounded the difficulties the victims must endure.
