# GUIDELINES FOR PUBLIC CONDUCT DURING TOWN BOARD MEETINGS

- 1. The Supervisor shall preside at the meetings of the Town Board. In the absence of the Supervisor, the Deputy Supervisor shall be the acting Supervisor. In the event both the Supervisor and the Deputy Supervisor are absent, the other members shall designate one of their members to act as temporary chairman. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but a lesser number may adjourn.
- 2. Town residents who wish to speak shall fill out a card at the entrances of the meeting room listing their name, contact information, and the subject matter in which they would like to speak. These cards will be collected prior to the beginning of the Town Board meeting and given to the Town Supervisor or Deputy Supervisor in the absence of the Supervisor.
- 3. Speakers must be recognized by the presiding officer and then proceed to the lectern and state their name and address. They must limit their remarks on official town business to up to three minutes on a given topic and may not yield any remaining time to another speaker. They must address their remarks to the Board as a body and not to any member thereof and not to other members of the audience in the form of a debate.
- 4. Speakers should present their remarks in a courteous manner and may not make disparaging remarks or personal comments about public officials, town residents, or others. All speakers will observe the commonly accepted rules of courtesy, decorum, dignity, and good taste with no cursing, swearing, clapping, booing, finger pointing, bullying, whispering, or talking that disrupts the proceedings of the business of the Town Board.
- 5. Any speaker who disregards the directives of the presiding officer in enforcing the rules, disturbs the peace at a meeting, makes impertinent or slanderous remarks, or generally conducts themselves in an inappropriate manner shall be barred from further participation and will forfeit any balance of time remaining for their comments.
- 6. After a final warning, if a speaker willfully refuses to step down, the Town Supervisor shall contact the appropriate authorities to remove the speaker from the meeting room and to restore order.
- 7. The Town Supervisor, or in their absence the Deputy Supervisor, shall ensure compliance with these rules.

This policy will be amended by Majority vote of the Town Board.

# RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF NEW BALTIMORE AUTHORIZING THE SUPERVISOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH GREENE COUNTY OUTLAWS, INC. d/b/a GREENE COUNTY OUTLAWS BASEBALL, TO USE AND MAINTAIN THE TOWN BASEBALL FIELDS LOCATED AT 1508 CR 54 AND 3 OLD KINGS ROAD, HANNACROIX

WHEREAS, the Town Board of the Town of New Baltimore (hereinafter referred to as the "Town") has received a request from Greene County Outlaws, Inc., more commonly referred to as Greene County Outlaws Baseball, to renew its Agreement with the Town, which has expired, to use and maintain the baseball fields located at 1508 CR 54 and 3 Old Kings Road, Hannacroix, which will be open to public and will be a betterment to and recreational opportunity for the public and the members of the Outlaw Baseball; and

WHEREAS, the Town previously reviewed the request in conjunction with the NYS Town Law §64 (7) and the Town's Park Use Permit and Procedure, declared itself Lead Agency of the within proposal and issued a Negative Declaration finding that no substantial environmental impact would arise from the project, and further conducted a site review of the proposal and determined that the proposal adequately meets each of the potential review standards, which are found in the Town's Site Plan Review Law; and

WHEREAS, nothing has changed with respect to the use and maintenance previously approved,

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby

RESOLVED, that the Town agrees to permit the Greene County Outlaws Baseball to use and maintain the subject baseball fields under the terms and conditions set forth in the previously submitted application materials, and as memorialized in the proposed Agreement attached hereto; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Town Supervisor has the authority to enter into the Agreement on behalf of the Town, whose signature is to be attested to by the Town Clerk; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the Agreement shall be executed in duplicate, and one original, along with the appropriate insurance certificates shall be kept on file with the Town Clerk.

# AGREEMENT TO USE AND MAINTAIN THE TOWN OF NEW BALTIMORE BASEBALL FIELD

("the User"):		

WITNESSETH, that the Town and the User, for the consideration hereinafter named, agree as follows:

#### ARTICLE 1. PURPOSE

The User, a travel youth baseball organization serving predominantly the residents of Greene County, desires to use the Town of New Baltimore's baseball fields located at 1508 County Route 54 and 3 Old Kings Road, Hannacroix, NY ("ball fields") as part of its youth baseball program for children ages 7 - 12.

#### ARTICLE 2. CONSIDERATION

In consideration of use of the ball field, the User agrees to:

- Prepare the ball field prior to the inception of use by the youth baseball program
  Generally maintain the ball fields for use throughout the spring, summer and fall
- 2. Prepare the ball fields on a daily basis when being used by the youth baseball program
- 3. Furnish equipment and other ancillary items necessary for the youth baseball coordinated under the Town's youth program.

Sections 1, 2 and 3 above shall include, but not be limited to cutting grass in both the infields and outfields, maintenance and repair of the scoreboard, cleaning and maintenance of the dugouts, and removal of all garbage collected during use of the fields

#### ARTICLE 3. INSURANCE

The User shall not be permitted to perform any work on the ball fields or use the ball fields as part of its youth baseball program until it has obtained the following insurance, which shall be for the duration of this Agreement and shall be approved by the Town Supervisor:

- 1. Worker's Compensation Insurance for its employees who as assigned to perform the work hereunder
- General Liability and Property Damage Insurance, naming the Town as additional insured, covering claims for damages for personal injury, including accidental death,

as well as claims for property damage which may arise from the activities permitted under this contract. The General Liability Insurance shall be in an amount not less than \$500,000 for injuries, including wrongful and/or accidental death to any one person and subject to the same limit for each person, and in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 on account of any on occurrence. Property Damage Insurance shall be in an amount not less than \$300,000 for damage occurring during the time period of this Agreement.

#### ARTICLE 4. PERIOD OF EFFECTIVENESS

This Agreement shall be effective for twenty months, beginning April 1, 2022 and expiring November 30, 2024. This Agreement may be renewed by the Town on a formal written request by the User for 20 month periods for up to 5 additional periods. In the event that the User notified the Town in writing of its desire to renew this Agreement, The Town shall be authorized to renew the Agreement by Resolution.

#### ARTICLE 5. TERMINATION

The Town may terminate this Agreement upon 30 days notice if the User is in violation or default of any of the provisions herein, or if there is any physical altercation or intervention of law enforcement during the period of use.

#### ARTICLE 6. REPORTING

- Any accident that occurred during the User's use of the ball field shall be reported
  to the office of the Town Supervisor as soon as possible, or if not occurring during
  normal business hours, no later than 24 hours from the time of such accident. A
  detailed written report must be submitted to the Town as soon thereafter as
  possible and not later than three (3) days after the date of such accident.
- 2. Any physical altercation occurring on the ball fields, or any matter which required the presence of law enforcement, shall be reported immediately to the office of the Town Supervisor, or, if not occurring during normal business hours, no later than 24 hours from the time of such accident. Such occurrence may result in the Town terminating this Agreement.

Failure to report, as mandated herein, shall be a violation of this Agreement.

### ARTICLE 7. PERMITS AND REGULATIONS

The User shall be responsible to procure and pay for any and all permits and licenses necessary for the work to be performed hereunder and the use of said ball fields in the manner allowed.

#### ARTICLE 8. INDEMNITY AND HOLD HARMLESS AGREEMENT

The User agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the Town, its officers, agents and employees harmless from any liability imposed upon the Town, its officers, agents and/or employees arising from the negligence or malfeasance, active or passive, of the User or its agents.

#### ARTICLE 9. ASSIGNMENT

This User is hereby prohibited from assigning, transferring, conveying, subletting or otherwise disposing of this Agreement, or of its right, title or interest in this Agreement, or its power to execute this Agreement, to any other person or corporation without the prior written consent of the Town.

### ARTICLE 10. NOTICES

All notice and payments required hereunder shall be addressed as follows, or to any such other addresses as may hereinafter be designated in writing by either party hereto, and shall be sent by certified mail, return receipt requested:

#### ARTICLE 11. WAIVER

No waiver of any breach of any condition of this Agreement shall be binding unless the same is in writing and signed by the party waiving said breach. No such waiver shall have any affect on any other term or condition of this Agreement or constitute a cause or excuse for a repetition of such or any other breach unless the waiver shall include the same.

#### ARTICLE 12. MODIFICATION.

This Agreement constitutes the complete understanding of the parties. No modification of any provisions thereof shall be valid unless in writing and signed by both parties. There shall be no oral modification of any term or provision herein.

# ARTICLE 13. APPLICABLE LAW

This Agreement is governed by the laws of the State of New York. Jurisdiction shall be limited to Greene County.

**WHEREAS** the Town Board authorizes Supervisor Ruso and Councilmember VanEtten to apply for a state-funded grant for Town Hall improvements.

WHERAS, the Town of New Baltimore will apply for the State and Municipal Facilities Capital Program (SAM) through DASNY in the amount of \$150,000 to help finance the construction of the Town Hall Accessibility Improvement Project (the "Project"), and

WHERAS, the SAM grant is a reimbursement-based grant program, and

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** the Supervisor of the Town of New Baltimore is authorized to undertake the Project, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Supervisor is authorized to execute a Grant Disbursement Agreement (GDA) with DASNY and any and all other contracts, documents, and instruments necessary to bring about the project and to fulfill the Town of New Baltimore's obligations under the GDA, and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Town of New Baltimore authorizes and appropriates \$150,000 to pay for the upfront costs of the Project. The source of the funds shall be from the Town's Reserve Account.



# Town of New Baltimore, Greene County, New York Town Hall Accessibility Improvements 2022

The Town of New Baltimore, in northern Greene County, is located between the foothills of New York State's Catskill Mountain region and the Hudson River. The Town Hall is located on County Route 51 approximately 1 mile west of Route 9W. The Town Hall is home to the Town Clerk's office, Town Assessor, Town Supervisor and Town Court among other important Town officials and is also the home of the Greene County Sheriff Satellite office. The Town Board and Planning Board hold regular monthly meetings in the Town Hall meeting room. Organizations and individuals can also apply for use of the facility.

Accessibility to the Town Hall is envisioned to be improved through construction of a new side entrance to New Baltimore Town Hall including removal of the existing stairs and construction of new stairs and walkway as well as a new ramp connecting to a new platform for a fully ADA compliant entrance to the building. Safety railings will be provided as will connections to the parking area.

Improvements to the Town Hall Main Entrance to the Clerk's office may include removal of the existing stair and ramp with construction of new stairs, platform and railings, and new connections to the sidewalk and driveway. In addition, the existing deteriorated Front Entrance stairs will be removed and replaced to provide attractive, safe access to the meeting room.

# RESOLUTION APPROVING AMENDED AGREEMENT FOR EXPENDITURE OF HIGHWAY MONEYS

**RESOLVED** that the attached Amended Agreement for Expenditure of Highway Monies submitted by Highway Superintendent Alan VanWormer (Highway 284 Agreement) is hereby approved.

# AMENDED AGREEMENT FOR THE EXPENDITURE OF HIGHWAY MONEYS

AGREEMENT between the Town Superintendent of the Town of New Baltimore, Greene County, New York, and the undersigned members of the Town Board.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 284 of the Highway Law, we agree that moneys levied and collected in the Town for the repair and improvement of highways, and received from the State for State Aid for the repair and improvement of highways, shall be expended as follows:

- 1. GENERAL REPAIRS. The sum of \$62,525 shall be set aside to be expended for primary work and general repairs upon 63.18 miles of town highways, including sluices, culverts and bridges having a span of less than five feet and boardwalks or the renewals thereof.
- 2. **PERMANENT IMPROVEMENTS**. The following sums shall be set aside to be expended for the permanent improvement of Town highways:
  - a. On the road commencing at <u>County Route 51</u> and leading to <u>Hannacroix Creek Bridge</u>, a distance of 2 miles, there shall be expended not over the sum of \$253,575.

Thickness: 1 1/2 inches

Hot mix pave Deans Mills Rd from County Route 51 for a distance of approximately 2 miles with 1.5 inches of Type 6 blacktop. To be paid by Chips.

b. On the road commencing at <u>State Route 9W</u> and leading to <u>State Route 9W</u>, a distance of <u>1.25</u> miles, there shall be expended not over the sum of <u>\$136,787.50</u>.

Type: Blacktop Overlay

Width of traveled surface: 20 feet

Thickness: 1 1/2 inches

Subbase: N/A

Hot mix pave Flatbush Rd from Route 9W to Route 9W a distance of approximately 1.25 miles with 1.5 inches Type 6 blacktop. To be paid by Chips, Pave NY, and EWR.

c. On the road commencing at State Route 9W and leading to Flatbush Rd, a distance

of 165 feet, there shall be expended not over the sum of \$4,347.

Type: Blacktop Overlay

Width of traveled surface: 20 feet

Thickness: 1 ½ inches

Subbase: N/A

Blacktop overlay 165 feet x 20 feet wide Taylor Rd from Route 9W to Flatbush Rd with Type 6 blacktop. To be paid by Chips, Pave NY, and balance from Budget DA 5110.4.

d. On the road commencing at <u>County Route 51</u> and leading to <u>Dead End</u>, a distance of <u>550 feet</u>, there shall be expended not over the sum of <u>\$5,433.75</u>.

Thickness: 1 ½ inches

Blacktop overlay approximately 550 feet of Hadley Drive from County Route 51 to Dead End. To be paid from Budget line DA 5110.4.
